Our unique Center, operated by dedicated members of the Repairers of the Breach homeless community, is not subsidized by any government money. We are a satellite of Literacy Center of Wisconsin. We are an outreach site for St. Ben’s Clinic, Impact, Wiscosh, Aids Resource Center, Project Return. Red Cross Psych Outreach, and more. Many faith communities and student groups share our journey. Our spiritual settings are optional. The public is welcome to attend Centering Prayer (Wednesday mornings) and the Brown Bag Lunches\* (ecumenical scripture & prayer, held 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Fridays from 12-1:00 year-round, except all Fridays during Lent & Advent). We are nonsectarian, we respect all faiths.

**What we offer ongoingly**: A safe, positive “living room” environment free of drugs, alcohol or violence. “Belonging”—to a community, a “family”.

**Core values: Hope, Dignity, Mutual Empowerment, Unity, Positive Change, Self-government, Solidarity, Justice.**

A mailing address. Careful mail distribution. A free telephone & message system. Hygiene Center--showers, towels & toiletries. Free clothing, outerwear. Tutored Reading/Math improvement and GED/HSED preparation. Alcohol & Drug Abuse Counseling, support groups, presenters. Couches for daytime sleeping for 3<sup>rd</sup> shift homeless workers. Resource lists. Peer networking. Resume development. Job announcements. Weekly community meetings, inspirational speakers.

Ownership of rules, self-governance. Training in good citizenship & volunteerism. Leadership development. Voter registration. Political voice. Voter education. Dialogue with students groups and faith communities. Eligibility for household goods and furniture after getting housing.
