

## June 2017 Monthly Report Repairers of the Breach Medical Clinic

As of June 22, 2017, our clinic is scheduled to be open **14 days**; at this time, **3 clinic days** remain. We have served **67 patients: 47 males and 20 females**, including eight women who attended our breast health clinic. We welcomed **14 new patients** into our clinic. Our volunteers provided **368 hours** of time and service to our patients, with a monetary value of **\$9,148.00**. Our external partners provided **32 hours** of service valued at **\$800.00**. At quarter-end, our volunteers generously provided **935 hours** of their time and talent, valued at **\$31,230.00**. External volunteers provided **112 hours** valued at **\$2,800.00**.

Through the kindness and generosity of our community, our clinic received **\$400.00** worth of medication, shoes, and reading glasses.

Our Marquette nursing students will be here for their last clinical visit on June 29, 2017. Our MSOE nursing students remain with us until August 2, 2017.

Our clinic continues to provide valuable life services to our patients and valuable life lessons for our students. Students are continually surprised by the existence of a clinic such as ours, which embraces the concept of whole person care and provides assistance in networking with other clinics and medical care facilities.

While the patient has the advantage of being provided with a complete exam, students also gain a different aspect of care. Our hope is that the students will remember their experience working at our clinic and take the empathy they learned helping our patients with them into the future.

Repairers of the Breach Medical Clinic continues to be a member of the *free clinic community collaborative*, where experiences in public policy and medicine are shared. We continue to advocate for the homeless and those at risk in our community. We help to build strong foundations through advocacy, education, and direct action.
